Defining the Future of the Terminal Island Freeway


The City of Long Beach is developing a Plan for transforming the Terminal Island (TI) Freeway to a local serving road, while increasing open space and buffering the westside community from air, noise, light and visual pollution. Green TI will result in a conceptual plan to decommission the City-owned segment of the freeway from Pacific Coast Highway north to Willow Street. Green TI will draw upon community and port-related engagement to identify alternative and preferred design concepts for the re-use of the TI Freeway, including new neighborhood connectivity for vehicles, bicycles and pedestrians.

Get Involved!

Public involvement in the preparation of the Plan is essential to its development and success. The planning process will involve a series of community meetings to help establish the vision, programming, and future design of the TI Freeway. Concurrently, sessions will be held with industry stakeholders to discuss key concerns regarding local impacts to the neighboring community and movement of goods.
